Dr Gail E. Evans (BA (Hons), Dip.Ed, LLB, SJD (USyd) Reader in International Trade and Intellectual Property Law) is a member of the Centre for Commercial Law Studies at Queen Mary, University of London where she teaches Legal Problems of International Trade and Intellectual Property Law; Trademark Law and; Intellectual Property Transactions.

Dr Evans also has considerable experience in the delivery of customized courses in intellectual property law for postgraduate study and professional development. She has taught International Intellectual Property Law at the Duke-Geneva Institute in Transnational Law; in the World Intellectual Property Organization's (WIPO) Master of Laws program and; and the Tulane Summer Program in London.

In 2008, she was nominated for the Queen Mary University of London Drapers' Award for Excellence in Teaching. She has published numerous articles in the field of International Intellectual Property Law, including the recent *"Strategic Patent Licensing for Public Research Organizations: Deploying Restriction and Reservation Clauses to Promote Medical R&D in Developing Countries"* American Journal of Law & Medicine, 34 (2008) 175.
