Mary W S Wong is a Professor of Law at the Franklin Pierce Law Center in the USA. Her research interests are in digital copyright reform and international copyright policy. Professor Wong is the current chair of the international copyright subcommittee of the American Bar Association's Intellectual Property Law Section (ABA-IPL), a member of the ABA-IPL Copyright Reform Task Force and the Editorial Board for the ABA-IPL's flagship publication. In addition, Professor Wong was recently elected to represent the Non-Commercial User Constituency in the Council of the Generic Names Supporting Organization at ICANN (the Internet Corporation for Assigned Names and Numbers.)

Professor Wong was previously Special Counsel to the international law firm of Morrison & Foerster LLP, resident primarily in its New York office, with secondments to its Brussels and Singapore offices. As a member of Morrison & Foerster's Technology Transactions Group, she counseled American, European and Asian clients on matters relating to electronic commerce, software licensing and information privacy. Professor Wong has also been an Associate Professor of Law at the Singapore Management University, and a Senior Lecturer in Law at the National University of Singapore. She has served on various committees to the Singapore Government and the Singapore Academy of Law, and was a Board member of the New York New Media Association. She is currently an Associate Fellow of the IP Academy of Singapore.

Professor Wong holds an LL.B (Hons.) from the National University of Singapore and an LL.M from the University of Cambridge. She is a frequent speaker at academic and industry conferences in the USA, Europe and Asia.
